The journey of a man from being born in a farmer's family to retiring as the headmaster of Maharashtra Sant Vidhyalaya, Ter, Osmanabad to now serving for the betterment of students and GEF. He is a simple man with incredible thoughts. He has already set the example of hardwork, determination and perseverance by succeeding in The Maharashtra Public Service Commission (MPSC). Let's have a talk with the inspiring personality, Mr Bhimrao Dnyanoba Chavan better known as our Chavan sir.

So post retirement, what made you guide the students and get involved with GEF?

I have spent almost all my educational years living in a hostel which made me a social person, I have always been fond of helping students so when GEF happened I couldn't stop myself from joining this prestigious foundation.

What's your first memory with the foundation?

I am attached to GEF, "why don't you join us?"

Annual day 2018 flashes the first when I think about GEF. The students specially from rural areas were delighted as it was their introduction to "Mumbai-the city of dreams" which started with an educational and fun tour followed with such a motivational and inspirational annual day. It was a well organised and disciplined event where students interacted with many professionals and carried home a lot of memories and experiences.

What has surprised you most about working with GEF?

The bond which keeps Dr Pradeep Waychal and all the people, from young to experienced connected. GEF functions as a family with Mrs. Waychal and the alumni being like a pillar to the younger ones. His aspiration to give support to poor not only financially but also making sure that the student he develops personally.

So sir, could you tell me how and when you got introduced to GEF?

I have spent almost all my educational years living in a hostel which made me a social person

I was getting retired as the headmaster of Maharshtra Sant Vidhyalaya, where I served for 33 years, from being a teacher, supervisor to headmaster. Dr Pradeep Waychal was invited as the chief guest of my farewell function where our President, Dr B.Y. Yadav introduced me to him. It was huge function attended by approximately 700 people. The next day Pradeep sir called me and asked me about my post retirement plans, I mentioned about my personal responsibilities and development of students of Osmanabad. He said "I am attached to GEF, why don't you join us?" and hence, I am a part of GEF. I look after the students of Osmanabad and also connect to our Mumbai team regularly.

So sir, some of the people you've met while working with the foundation?

There are many people I have met but some I would like to highlight, Pradeep sir, the one because of whom I got connected to this foundation and experienced Mumbai. I am always amazed by seeing Mrs. Sandhya Waychal's energy. She is never tired. She has the same energy and the smile which she carries throughout the day. Mr Sampat Ingale who inspired me totally by his work and experiences. I also remember meeting Amruta and Ankita Raut, their dedication towards GEF and their command over English. I also told my wife about these bright sisters.

Could you brief your life journey? Your journey from childhood to retirement.

I come from a farmer's family from Chavanwadi, a small village near Tuljapur. I did my primary education till 4th from my village and then did further education till 10th from Z.P. High school, Katgaon. My father died when I was very young, my brother nobly decided to support the family at the cost of his career. I then did my junior college, B.A. from Sangli M.A. in English from Shivaji University, Kolhapur. I persued my B.Ed. From Dayanand College, Solapur and then joined Maharashtra Sant Vidhyalaya, Ter, Osmanabad. I served as a teacher for 33 years ,joined as a teacher, then a supervisor and retired as the headmaster.

I had also prepared for The Maharashtra Public Service Commission (MPSC) in 1986 and could successfully clear the Prelims. Due the deteriorating health of my mother, I had to miss History's main exam. Further due to the financial crisis and increasing responsibilities, I had to continue my journey as a teacher.

I am the Chairman of our housing society and I have been running a free library at my native place, a small hamlet, from


Watched the life story of a German women who lost her eyesight at age 12, an inspiring story of actor Jitendra Joshi.







